UWC MOVEMENT

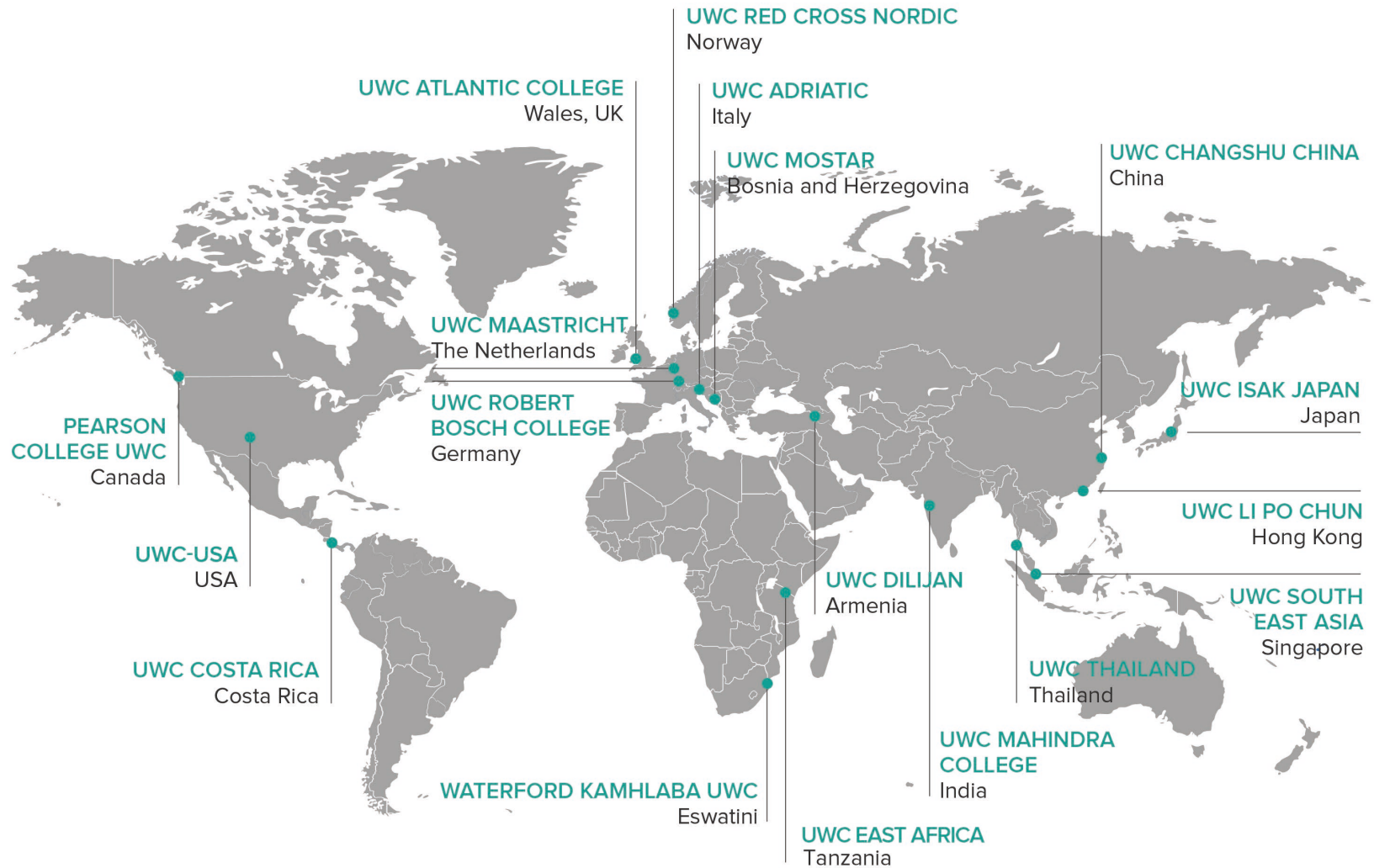

UWC EDUCATION

ALL UWC SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES TEACH THE IB DIPLOMA (INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE)

The IB Diploma is one of the most well regarded and widely known secondary school qualifications in the world and is recognised by the world's leading universities.

Students study six subjects, three at higher level and three at standard level.

Subjects are divided into groups and students choose one subject from each group: First Language, Second Language, Individuals and Societies, Mathematics and Computer Sciences, Experimental Sciences and Arts.



CAMPUS LIFE

LIVING ON CAMPUS IS A SIGNIFICANT PART OF THE UWC EXPERIENCE FOR MANY OF OUR STUDENTS

All UWC schools and colleges are influenced by their local geography and culture. Each year, with a variety of nationalities, cultures, backgrounds and languages, the student body adds a further influence.

Through living as well as studying together, students learn about other cultures and the importance of international and intercultural understanding.

The UWC staff who also live on campus or in the student residences play an important role in pastoral care.



SERVICE AND ACTIVITIES

INVOLVEMENT IN ARTISTIC PURSUITS, PHYSICAL ACTIVITY AND COMMUNITY SERVICE IN BASED ON THE CREATIVITY, ACTION, SERVICE (CAS)

CAS is an integral part of campus life as well as one of the IB requirements. Students learn skills in reflection, goal-oriented strategizing, and stewardship.

With a range of indoor and outdoor activities, students can participate in various clubs, groups and events.

Students are given the responsibility and courage to identify opportunities and take the lead in community service projects, which are diverse and appropriate to the local environment.



APPLICATIONS

UWC Cayman Islands typically selects 2-3 students per year. The application process consists of written application, individual interviews and group stage.

Students are selected solely on merit without regard to socio-economic background and ability to pay. UWC Cayman Islands relies on fundraisers and the generous sponsorship of individuals, corporations and other organisations in order to assist with funding UWC scholars. Parents partake in an assessment to determine how much they are able to contribute. Scholarships can cover all or part of a scholar's tuition and accommodation costs (including meals and school trips) and may also include assistance with travel and other expenses if necessary.

To apply through UWC Cayman Islands students must be:

- 16 or 17 by Sept 1 of application year
- Caymanian
